About Us

Samartha Trust a non-profit organization was started in April 2019 in Bangalore. The organization is dedicated to fostering an inclusive and equitable society for children facing challenging conditions. With a deep commitment to empowering these children, Samartha Trust endeavors to provide them with the necessary support, resources, and opportunities to thrive. Through our various initiatives and programs, the organization aims to create a nurturing environment where every child, regardless of their circumstances, can realize their full potential and lead a fulfilling life.

The organization's primary focus is on disabled and vulnerable children from marginalized communities. They rescue and enroll these children in school, providing residential care to those facing hardships. Additionally, the organization operates community learning centers in Bangalore's slums, running sensitization programs to promote awareness and social inclusion for these children. This effort aims to give them and their communities a fair and equal opportunity for growth and development, like any other.

Organisation History



Samartha Trust was founded in 2019 by Sardar Basheer a social activist and educator who has been working in the development sector for the past 15 years, mainly in the field of children's education, started the organization with a mission to foster an inclusive and equitable society for marginalized and disabled children. The organization's primary goal is to facilitate the social inclusion of children with disabilities, beginning with their enrolment in schools and the sensitization of their immediate communities, including families, neighbours, and schools. I have contributed to the development and execution of community-based sensitization programs focused on addressing this crucial issue for the past 15 years

With 15 years of experience at the SAMA Foundation, I have gained a deep understanding of the educational landscape. Throughout my tenure, I have served in various capacities, focusing on disability rights, child rights, empowerment of urban communities, and the promotion of inclusive education in government schools. Additionally, I have contributed to the development of disability-friendly psychosocial care programs and livelihood initiatives. I had the privilege of contributing to the drafting of Samanvaya, a handbook for disabled education, as a committee member for the Samagra Shikshana Abhiyana under the Education Department of Karnataka. I am eager to bring my dedication and experience to support Samartha Trust's mission, with the hope that together we can provide essential education to those with disabilities and in need.

Key Milestones and Growth

In its early years, Samartha Trust focused on Inclusive Education for Children with Special Needs by ensuring children with disabilities have equal access to Inclusive Education and enjoy learning. The organization gradually expanded its programs by rehabilitating 40 disabled children with skill development and livelihood programs.

The school Readiness center for children with disabilities was started in the year 2019 by supporting 30 disabled children.

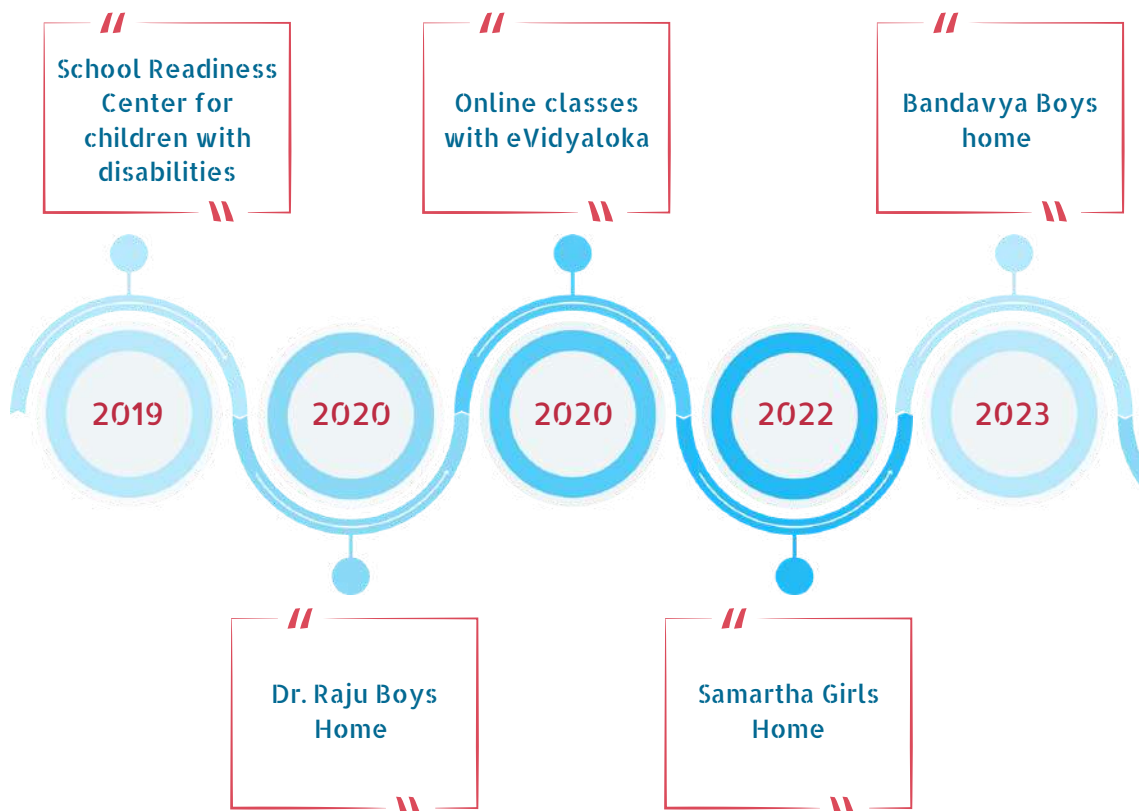

Residential care homes have been established in three locations across Bangalore. Dr. Raju Boys Home was inaugurated in 2022, providing support to 25 boys. Samartha Girls Home, supporting 20 girls, was established in 2023, along with Bandavya Boys Home, which supports 10 children. Additionally, an online education program with eVidyaloka was initiated in 2020, supporting 12 government schools by conducting online classes for 1200 students.

Over the years, Samartha Trust has grown its network of partners and volunteers, including government officials, educational institutions, and other NGOs, enabling us to reach more communities and expand our impact.

Our Current Programs and Activities

Since 2019, Samartha Trust has been dedicated to improving the lives of vulnerable children and marginalized communities. Our current programs and activities include:

SCHOOL READINESS CENTER FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES

The program offers a comprehensive support, particularly focusing on those facing challenging circumstances requiring additional attention. Our program is dedicated to fostering a joyful childhood for these children. To instill positive attitudes and confidence at an early age, we conduct a 'Child to Child' program that includes Personality Development sessions, Summer camps, and Adventure camps. Our program caters to children with Cerebral palsy, Intellectual disability, Autism, and ADHD (Attention Deficient Hyperactive Disorder). These activities take place at our School Readiness Center, where children learn Daily Living Skills, receive therapeutic support, and are introduced to basic concepts in Language, Mathematics, and Communication. Currently, we support 45 children (24 boys and 21 girls) with disabilities through our 'School Readiness Program' in South Bangalore, providing essential education to the Anjanappa Garden community.

DR. RAJU BOYS HOME

Dr. Raju Boys Home is a residential facility for underprivileged boys, including street children, runaways, and orphans. Located in the Vijayanagar Public School Premises, Chandra Layout, Bangalore, the home currently accommodates 25 boys. It provides them with shelter, care, and education in English medium.

SAMARTHA GIRLS HOME

Following the success of Dr. Raju Boys Hostel, Samartha Trust initiated a similar setup for girls living on the streets and in challenging circumstances. With the support of Mr. Ramalinga Reddy, Minister of Transport, Mr. Mohan, and the school management, Samartha Girls Home was established on July 27, 2023. Identifying girls in dire need of support for their growth and development, we enrolled 25 children into Samartha Girls Home. These home offered stability, emotional support, and access to education and healthcare, which are often lacking in their previous circumstances. The home created a positive impact on their physical, emotional, and cognitive development, helping them grow into confident and independent individuals.

BANDAVYA BOYS HOME

Bandavya Boys Home is a residential facility for underprivileged boys, including street children, runaways, and orphans. Located in the Govt higher primary School Premises, Vimanapura, Bangalore, the home currently accommodates 10 boys. It provides them with shelter, care, and education. This program is run in collaboration with Need Base India.

ONLINE CLASSES WITH EVIDYALOKA

Samartha Trust partnered with E-Vidyaloka to conduct online classes for 5th to 8th-grade students from government schools in rural areas of Anekal, Bangalore, starting in 2021. A total of 1234 students from 12 government schools benefited from these classes. A team of 14 members from Samartha Trust coordinated the program across various locations in Anekal Taluk. We believe that while education is crucial for a better future, engaging children in creative activities is equally important as it helps them discover their talents and fosters happiness.

SOLE CENTER

In collaboration with eVidyaloka, Samartha Trust started a Self-Learning Center for 60 children, empowering them to explore the world of knowledge at their own pace. The center gives a space for vulnerable children from marginalized communities to come together and learn together by sharing their knowledge.

Issues of Children Admitted to Samartha Trust

Since 2019, Samartha Trust has been dedicated to improving the lives of disabled people, vulnerable children and marginalized communities. Children admitted to Samartha Trust are vulnerable children, street children, orphans, children with disabilities, and those from families with alcoholic parents, face a range of issues:

1. Many children have experienced traumatic events such as abuse, neglect, or abandonment, leading to emotional distress and behavioral issues.
2. Children often come from backgrounds where access to education is limited or non-existent, impacting their future prospects and opportunities and health issues due to neglect, malnutrition, and lack of access to proper healthcare services.
3. Children often come from impoverished backgrounds, with limited access to basic necessities such as food, shelter, and clothing.
4. Children with alcoholic parents who are neglected, abused, and instability at home, affect their overall well-being and development.
5. Children with disabilities require specialized care, support, and access to resources that may not be available, Samartha Trust provides the support.
6. Children from vulnerable backgrounds, such as orphans or street children, may face social stigma and discrimination, impacting their self-esteem and integration into society.

INTRODUCTION —

In the past year, Samartha has extended its reach to support a total of 1404 children across various programs. These programs include the School Readiness Center for children with disabilities, Dr. Raju Boys Home, Online classes with eVidyaloka, Samartha Girls Home, Bandavya Boys Home, and the Sole Center.

The School Readiness Center has been a cornerstone in providing specialized care and support for 45 children with disabilities, ensuring they receive the necessary tools and guidance for a bright future. Dr. Raju Boys Home has provided a nurturing environment for 25 young boys, offering them a safe haven and educational opportunities.

Through online classes with eVidyaloka, Samartha has reached out to 1234 children, providing them with access to quality education and empowering them to realize their full potential. Samartha Girls Home has continued its mission of empowering young girls, supporting 25 girls with education and life skills.

Bandavya Boys Home and Sole Center have also played pivotal roles in supporting 15 and 60 children, respectively, providing them with the necessary support and resources for a better future.

Samartha remains committed to its vision of a society where every child has access to quality education, healthcare, and opportunities for growth. As we reflect on the past year's achievements and challenges, we look forward to continuing our journey toward a brighter and more inclusive future for all children.

Program Progress Update on Residential Care Home's

During the annual year, Samartha Trust organized several activities and events for 65 children across our three residential homes. The center enrolled children in various programs focusing on their education, health, skill development, counseling, quarterly assessments, life skills, and value education. As these children come from vulnerable backgrounds without many opportunities, these classes and sessions played a crucial role in helping them overcome their challenges and boosting their learning skills.



Education

We are delighted to announce that during the past year, 65 students from our residential homes have been successfully enrolled in schools. These students were previously not enrolled and had dropped out of school. Initially, they underwent a bridge course where our staff helped them with the basics of the language, syllabus comprehension, and sentence formation, and provided one-on-one learning sessions. Monthly assessments were conducted to monitor their progress. As the children performed well in their bridge course, they were subsequently enrolled in regular classes. This achievement is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our staff and the determination of these students to pursue their education.

During the past year, our efforts in providing remedial classes, one-to-one learning, life skills, value education, and assessments to 65 children from Dr. Raju Boys Home, Samartha Girls Home, and Bandavya Boys Home have yielded significant positive outcomes. With the support of Samartha Trust, these vulnerable children have overcome learning difficulties and flourished in various aspects of their lives.



On a daily basis, our dedicated team provided personalized attention to each child, addressing their specific needs and challenges. The remedial classes helped them catch up with their peers and improve their academic performance. The one-to-one learning sessions not only boosted their confidence but also provided them with a safe space to express themselves and receive individualized support.

Moreover, the life skills and value education imparted to these children have equipped them with essential tools to navigate life's challenges. They have developed important skills such as decision-making, problem-solving, and effective communication, which are crucial for their overall development.





Through regular assessments, we were able to track the progress of these children and tailor our interventions accordingly. As a result, we have witnessed remarkable improvements in their learning abilities, behavior, and overall well-being.

Samartha Trust has been instrumental in providing these children with the necessary support and guidance to thrive. Together, we have created a nurturing environment where every child is given the opportunity to reach their full potential. We are proud of the progress these children have made and remain committed to supporting them in their journey towards a brighter future.



HEALTH & HYGIENE

During the past year, our Health & Hygiene support program for 65 children from Dr. Raju Boys Home, Samartha Girls Home, and Bandavya Boys Home has had a significant impact on their overall well-being. Through quarterly regular health check-ups, eye examinations, dental check-ups, and monitoring of Body Mass Index (BMI), we have been able to address the health needs of these vulnerable children.



We are pleased to share that as a result of our efforts, 16 students have transitioned from being underweight to achieving a normal weight. This improvement is a testament to the effectiveness of our health interventions and the dedication of our team.

Furthermore, the overall BMI of the children has shown improvement compared to the previous year, indicating a positive trend in their health status. This improvement reflects the success of our Health & Hygiene support program in promoting better health outcomes for these children.

Through our continuous efforts, we aim to further enhance the health and well-being of these children, ensuring that they have access to the necessary support and resources to lead healthy and fulfilling lives.

LIFE SKILL & VALUE EDUCATION

Life skills and value education are integral parts of personal growth and development. During the annual team conducted weekly value education, these teachings go beyond traditional academics, focusing on equipping children with the necessary tools to navigate life successfully. Life skills sessions such as communication, critical thinking, decision-making, and problem-solving abilities can greatly impact one's overall well-being and success. Moreover, we conducted value education to instill important principles like empathy, integrity, respect, and responsibility, shaping children into compassionate and ethical members of society. By embracing these teachings, children can lead more fulfilling lives and contribute positively to the world around them.

EXPOSURE VISIT



During the past year, our team organized a wide range of celebrations to provide 65 children with the opportunity to explore different cultural festivals, national and international celebrations, and important dates. These celebrations were aimed at creating awareness and educating the children about the significance of various events.



We celebrated events such as World Environment Day, International Yoga Day, Independence Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Deepawali, Movie Day, Children's Day, Christmas Celebration, Annual Sports Day, Holi Celebration, and educational tours. Each of these events was designed to not only entertain the children but also to educate them about the cultural, social, and environmental significance of these occasions.

Through these celebrations, we were able to create a sense of belonging and community among the children, while also providing them with valuable knowledge and insights into different cultures and traditions. We believe that by exposing children to a diverse range of experiences, we can help them become more open-minded, empathetic, and culturally aware individuals.

World Environment Day

World Environment Day aims to emphasize the significance of the environment and serve as a reminder that nature should be valued. Celebrated worldwide to honor and appreciate all that the environment provides, it encourages a commitment to its protection. During this event, our students planted saplings and learned about the importance of the occasion.

International Yoga Day

International Yoga Day aims to promote balance between body, soul, and mind. It facilitates an understanding of life's purpose and equips individuals to navigate changing environments effectively. With its roots in ancient traditions, yoga offers physical, mental, and spiritual benefits, providing calmness, peace, confidence, and courage. During this event, students were educated about the advantages of incorporating regular yoga practice into their routines.

Independence Day

Celebrating 76 Independence Day: India prepared to mark its 75th year of Independence on August 15th. Learn about the historical and cultural significance of this day, honoring our freedom fighters and the nation's achievements. It serves as a reminder of India's new era post British colonial rule of over 200 years. The celebration includes engaging children at Dr. S Raju Boys Hostel in commemorating Independence Day.



On October 24th, our Hostel celebrated Deepawali, known as the festival of lights, with great enthusiasm. It is a tradition to light crackers during Deepawali. Leading up to the festival, everyone in the Hostel, including children, teachers, and staff, participated in cleaning the premises and decorating for the pooja ceremony, ensuring that the entire Hostel was spotless. The celebration began with a pooja ceremony in the Hostel, where the children were briefed on safely enjoying the crackers. The children were delighted to partake in the festival of lights, and after the instructions, they were taken outside to play and celebrate. Witnessing the joyous faces of the children during the celebration was truly heartwarming.

CINEMA FOR FILM:

Samartha focuses on the holistic development of children across various aspects, recognizing the importance of diverse sources of entertainment. The staff and Hostel Teacher decided to treat the children to a film at the cinema. On November 13th, the children were taken to watch the movie Gandhada Gudi, featuring the beloved actor Powerstar Puneet Rajkumar. The film received positive feedback from the children, who particularly enjoyed Puneet Rajkumar's performance. After the screening, the children shared their feedback enthusiastically, expressing how it helped them unwind, relax, and improved their focus on studies.



Children's Day Celebration:

Every year on November 14th, Children's Day is celebrated throughout India to promote awareness of children's rights, well-being, and education. This day also pays homage to India's First Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru. To mark Children's Day, the Decathlon team visited our Hostel and invited our students to their campus for a day filled with happiness and joy. In the morning, the Decathlon team arrived at the center, gathered all the children, provided them with essentials and snacks, and organized various activities, games, and fun plays for their enjoyment. Following the fun-filled activities, the children were treated to lunch and engaged in playful interactions with the Samartha children.

Celebrating Christmas:

On December 25th, we had a Christmas celebration at our Hostel. The day before Christmas, we decorated our Hostel and rooms, and distributed Santa Claus dresses and caps to the hostel students. Everyone, including the staff and children, enjoyed the day by cutting cakes, decorating the Christmas tree, and spending time with the students. After the function, the teacher shared the story of Jesus and how he came to Mother Mary, captivating the children with the tale. A Christmas tree was placed in the center, adorned with garlands and other decorations. A cake was cut with all the children, and Christmas caps were given out to everyone.



Annual Sports Day:

On January 8th, Need Base India hosted a grand Annual Sports Day with over 450 students and 50 staff members in attendance. The event was a success, with students from Samartha Trust actively participating and contributing to the festivities. The day featured final games, competitions among Homes of Need Base India, and Samartha Boys engaging in the Cup Race, emerging victorious. HOLI CELEBRATION:

Holi, known as the Festival of Colours, Love, and Spring, is a widely celebrated Hindu festival that commemorates the enduring love between the gods Radha and Krishna. On March 8th, we marked the Holi festival in our Hostel where all students joyfully painted each other with colors, engaging in playful festivities. Initially, the Samartha staff educated the children about the essence of Holi, emphasizing a simple and gentle celebration without harsh colors. Following the teachers' guidance, the students beautifully embraced the festival of colors, relishing the joyful occasion.

Educational Tour:

The Samartha Trust arranged a 2-day trip to Mangalore from February 4th to February 5th, with 30 children, 10 parents, and 6 staff members on the bus. On the morning of February 4th, the children visited the Zoo at Pilikula Nisargadhama and had a delightful time observing the animals. After the zoo visit, they had lunch at Durga Parmeshwari Temple. Later, in the afternoon, the children had a fun-filled time at Malpe beach, enjoying the water and the beach activities. The next day, everyone had breakfast in the morning, followed by a boat ride at Karawal Beach. They then visited the Shri Krishna Temple for lunch before heading back to Udupi. The group left Mangalore in the evening and returned to Bangalore early the next morning.



COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTER:

Throughout the year, the Samartha Team initiated a community learning center in Kadugondanahalli to address the educational needs of marginalized children who had never attended school and were engaged in labor activities due to their families' financial constraints and migration issues. Recognizing these challenges, we enrolled 50 children in the center, providing them with remedial classes, bridge courses, nutrition support, value education, socio-cultural formation, and psychophysical development. Additionally, we facilitated their enrollment in local government schools.



As a result of these efforts, the children now attend evening classes regularly at the center and have shown significant improvement in their academics. We are pleased to report that the program has successfully supported these children, ensuring they receive the necessary support and are reintegrated into the formal education system.

ONLINE CLASSES WITH EVIDYALOKA

During the period from 2022 to 2023, the Samartha Trust & eVidyaloka program achieved a significant milestone by implementing its educational initiatives in 12 new schools. These efforts targeted students ranging from the 5th to the 7th standard, encompassing a crucial phase in their academic journey. The program's expansion played a pivotal role in shaping the educational landscape for these young minds, reaching and positively impacting a total of 1,287 children.



Through the concerted efforts of the Samartha Trust and the eVidyaloka program, access to quality education became a reality for these young learners, empowering them with knowledge and skills that would undoubtedly shape their future. Additionally, Twvle Community Ambassadors (CAs) underwent comprehensive training with eVidyaloka, equipping them with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively facilitate online classes.



The training program focused on various aspects of online teaching, including interactive teaching techniques, effective use of digital resources, classroom management strategies, and methods to engage students in a virtual learning environment. The goal was to empower the FCs and CAs with the expertise needed to create a dynamic and engaging online learning experience for the students they would be guiding.



Throughout the past year, eVidyaloka effectively assisted 1287 students through its online education programs at Anekal 9 schools, focusing on subjects such as English, mathematics, and science. These classes not only enhanced students' skills but also provided them with advanced technological support for their online learning experience, alongside initiatives for school infrastructure.

EMPOWERING DISABLED CHILDREN THROUGH INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

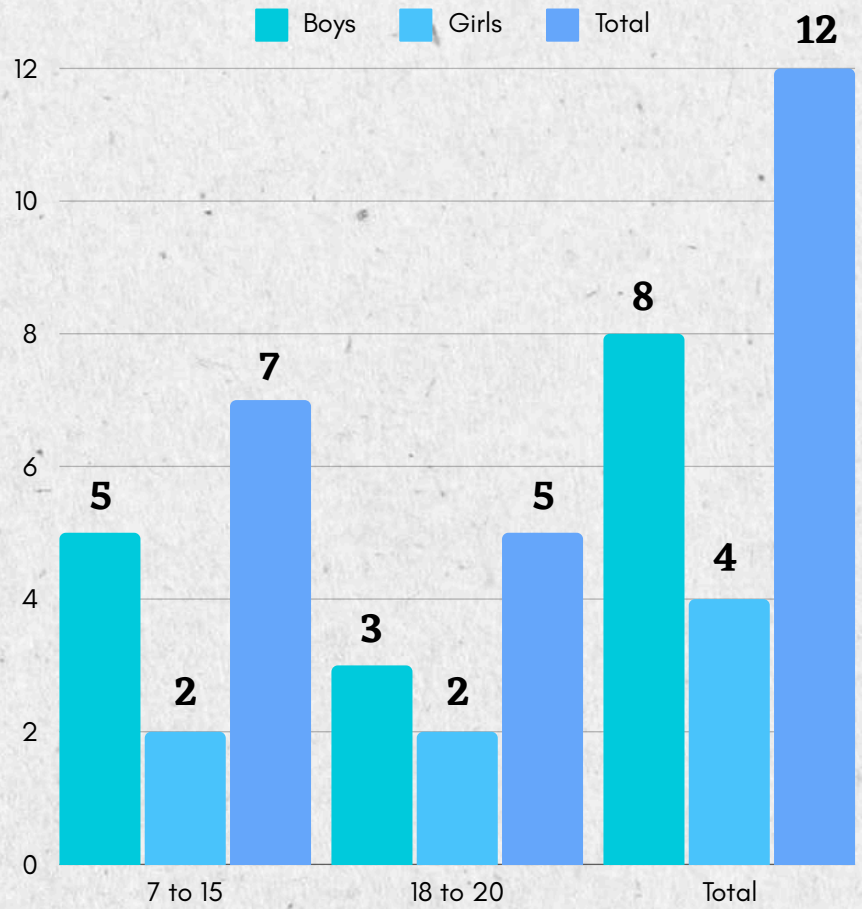
Samartha Trust for disabled children is committed to providing inclusive education, ensuring every child, regardless of their abilities, has access to quality education. We prioritize basic education, focusing on activities of daily living (ADLs) to foster independence. Our curriculum emphasizes color identification, stimulating cognitive development, and fostering creativity. Moreover, we incorporate activities that enhance hand-eye coordination, essential for motor skills we empower children to reach their full potential and lead fulfilling lives. Together, we are building a more inclusive and equitable society where every child has the opportunity to thrive. We empower these children to thrive academically and socially, breaking barriers and promoting inclusivity in education.

Throughout the year, our team at the disabled center implemented a range of activities aimed at enhancing the daily lives of our beneficiaries. These activities included Inclusive Education, Basic Education for Children, Activities of Daily Living (ADLS), Color Identification, and Hand-Eye Coordination. As a result, we witnessed an improvement in the overall well-being and development of the individuals we serve.

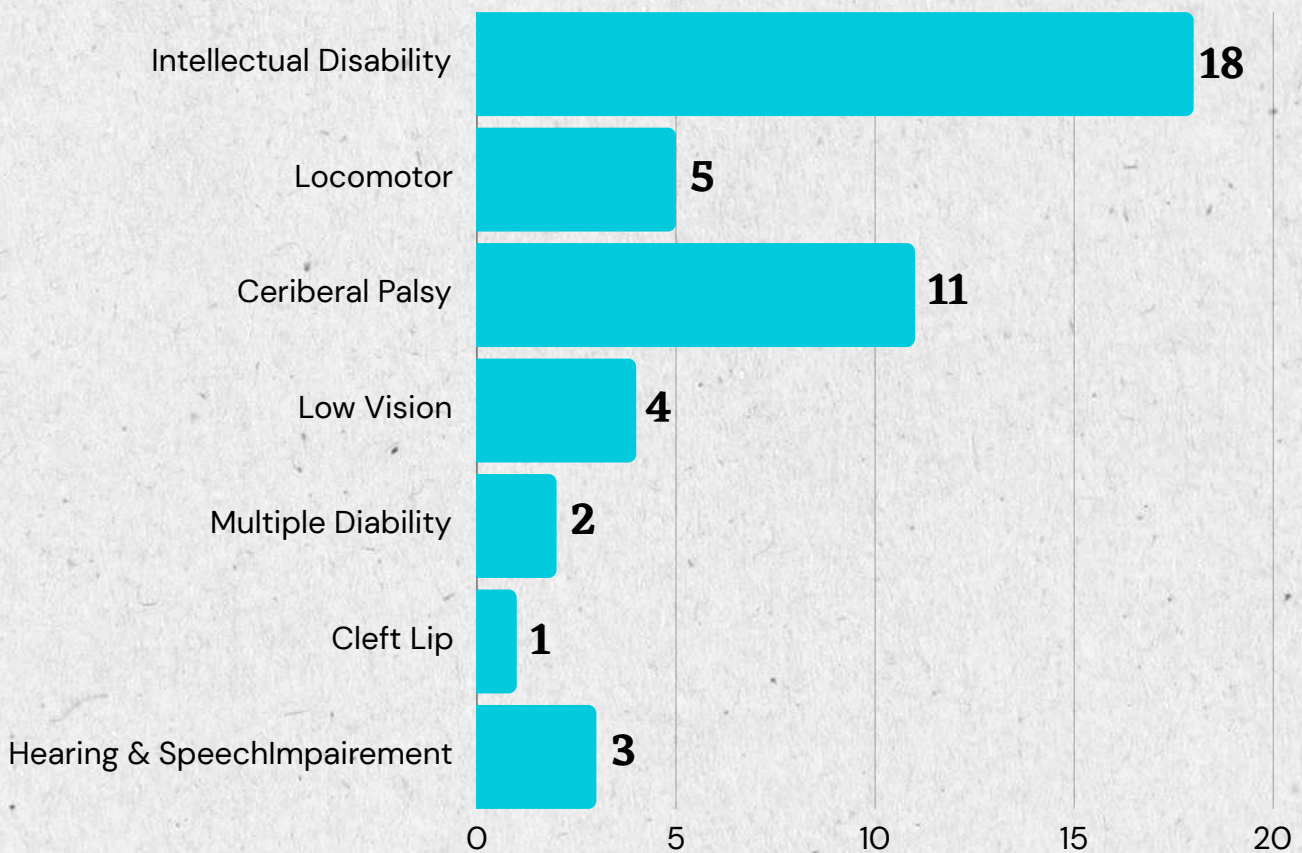
PHYSIOTHERAPY PROGRAMS & THERAPEUTIC SESSIONS:

In our physiotherapy sessions for disabled children, our experienced physiotherapists conducted comprehensive assessments to identify areas of concern and develop personalized treatment plans. These plans are tailored to address each child's unique needs and challenges. We utilized a variety of physiotherapy exercises. By following these personalized plans, we aim to support the physical development and well-being of each child, we empower them to overcome limitations and achieve their full potential. Our holistic approach ensured that children received the individualized care and attention they deserved, fostering progress and enhancing their quality of life.

Providing aids and Appliances:

During the annual year, we provided access to assistive devices and adaptive equipment to support 45 disabled children with mobility impairments. By providing wheelchairs and walkers we ensure that children have the necessary tools to enhance their independence and mobility. Our team of specialists offers guidance on the selection, fitting, and usage of Appliance assistive devices, empowering children to navigate their environment with confidence and ease.



Perspective Building and Disability Training for Parents Report

On the 6th of February, Samartha Trust organized a perspective-building and disability training program for parents of children with disabilities, aimed at empowering them with knowledge and skills to effectively support their children's development. The program encompassed various components:

Medicine Distribution

During the annual year, we conducted 12 medicine distributions on a monthly basis of 1st week of every month for 15 children who require regular medication for Epilepsy and other medicines. This initiative ensured that essential medications were consistently provided to children in need, contributing to their ongoing health and well-being.



SOLE CENTER – SELF LEARNING CENTER

Inspired by Sugata Mitra's Hole in the Wall concept Self an Organized Learning Environment (SOLE); our 'Self Learning Centre' aims to create a program where children can learn anything that they wish to, driving curiosity and open learning. The Learning Center integrated learning with technology, to facilitate easy access and flexibility, thereby enabling a holistic learning environment for children of all age groups and can be extended to the community as well.

This program is mainly for the benefit of children between the ages of 06 to 16 years to provide them with unrestricted, joyful learning using the facilities provided by the center, and help them learn effectively to enhance their competence and confidence over a period.



We spark the curiosity of the children by asking some of the questions, like Why Doctor wear a White coat instead of other colors? Can animals think? How does my digestion system work? What is Pythagoras' theorem? prepare for the realities of the future workplace and the rapidly changing technological landscape, it is critical for educators to invite kids to get good at asking big questions that lead them on intellectual journeys to pursue answers, rather than only memorizing facts. After a series of experiments revealed that groups of children can learn almost anything by themselves.



Samartha Trust collaborated with E-Vidyaloka and CA Grameen running one center in the Karpur village in Anekal. So far, we have Facilitated about 80 children who were from govt schools, and private school students have been confined to regular schools.







PARTNERSHIPS AND COLLABORATIONS
